## Dear President Trump:

Over the past few months I have held more than a dozen listening sessions across Montana with patients, providers, and public health officials. These folks know what's working and what's not working with our current system, and I am eager to bring their ideas and concerns directly to you.

When it comes to health care, our families and our economy depend on us putting politics aside and working together to find commonsense solutions to lower costs, protect Medicare and increase access to life-saving medical care. I hope that you and I will have the chance to work together on behalf of these families and the rural communities they proudly call home.
