CARD Information Technology Update and Expansion

Center for Asbestos Related Disease

\$294,097

Funding will be used to update and expand CARD's Information Technology equipment in order to be compliant with the upcoming federal mandate in 2014 requiring all medical records to be electronic. In addition, funds will allow for an IT specialist on-staff (wages and benefits), and expanded IT equipment to assist with outreach, clinic, and research needs.

Cardiac Care Project

St. Peter's Hospital

Funds will be used to purchase of a Cardiac PACS (Picture Archived Communication System) that will fully integrate with the electronic medical record system that is in the process of being implemented at St. Peter's.

Center for Health Education & Chronic Care

St. James Healthcare Foundation

Butte, MT

\$5,000,000

Funds would be used to acquire and improve property to establish a physical location, expand and enhance the current diabetes care network, develop space for clinical training and staff and purchase new equipment to treat chronic conditions.

Center for Healthcare Education and Simulated Hospital Training

Montana State University: Great Falls College of Technology

Great Falls, MT

\$750,000

Funds will be used to acquire basic equipment to get the simulated training hospital in operation to meet the needs of dedicated nursing teams.

Civil Engineering Phase II

Carroll College

Helena, MT

\$750,000

Funds will be spent on lab expansion, improved handicapped access, new equipment and upgrades to the computing and information access infrastructure of the building.

College Outreach for the 21st Century

Student Assistance Foundation Helena, MT \$100,000

Funds will provide equipment and services to enhance and expand existing college access initiatives through the use of technology to reach more Montana students, especially in rural areas.

Cross-Cultural Education: Science and Native American Environmental Ethics Program

University of Notre Dame Notre Dame, IN \$987,000

Funds will go toward staff and student support to increase the program from 8 to 16 students who will take part in an environmental education program that infuses Native American environmental knowledge and ethics with modern scientific and technical knowledge to better address pressing environmental problems.

Education and Technical Training Center

Crow Tribe of Indians Crow Agency, MT \$1,800,000

Funds will be used for equipment and salaries for staff who will educate and train constituents in skilled trades, science, technology and engineering fields so they are prepared to build and operate the Many Stars CTL project and related clean energy projects.

Emergency Services

Pioneer Medical Center Big Timber, MT \$973,542

This project will add diagnostic imaging and emergency response capabilities by expanding the current facility to include a CT scanner and build a replacement ambulance barn.

Enterprise Health Record Implementation

North Valley Hospital Foundation Whitefish, MT \$3,500,000

Funds will initially be focused on improving the core facility computer hardware and network as well as the clinical and bedside personal computing systems to support a secure EHR implementation by allowing purchase and implementation of upgraded EHR modules for areas where some automation has already been applied and then implementation of additional EHR modules for areas of the facility where no automation has been attempted to date.

Environmental Studies Lab and Program Improvements

Carroll College Helena, MT \$650,000

Funds will be spent on lab expansion, improved handicapped access, new equipment and upgrades to the computing and information access infrastructure of the building.

Expansion Project

Missouri River Medical Center Fort Benton, MT \$710,500

Funds will all go toward constructing a new 7 bed critical access hospital, a 45 bed nursing home and a clinic for four providers. Initial funds will be used to purchase the land, complete the survey and geotechnical work and finalize the concept plan development work.

Facilities and Equipment

Bozeman Deaconess Foundation Bozeman, MT \$2,750,000

These funds will be used to purchase vital technological additions: a Linear

Accelerator, Computerized Physician Order Entry and Emergency Department Electronic Health Records that will be available to serve the more than 100,000 residents of Southwest Montana.

Facilities and Equipment

Marias Medical Center Shelby, MT \$522,500

Funds will be used to purchase diagnostic equipment: a radiographic/flouro X-ray unit, ultrasound equipment and a computerized radiographic (CR) reader that will transition images into a format ready for transition to electronic medical records to help meet healthcare needs of elderly and low income citizens of north central Montana.

Facility Upgrades

Roosevelt Medical Center Culbertson, MT \$520,000

This project will replace facility air handling systems, replace individual room heating/air conditioning units, replace windows in patient rooms and replace flooring.

Great Falls Easter Seals-Goodwill building consolidation project

Easter Seals-Goodwill Northern Rocky Mountain Great Falls, MT \$915,000

Funds will be used to consolidate five separate service sites into one in Great Falls, Montana for the purpose of providing better services for people with a wide variety of disabilities and other disadvantaging conditions.

Health Care Informatics Certification for rural health professionals

\$1,250,000

Funds will be used for scholarships and expanding online programs to meet the growing demand for new high-tech health care information management professionals.

Hospital Generator Upgrade Project

\$696,368

Funds will be used to purchase duplex generator equipment that will improve electrical capacity 100%, increase work space for maintenance staff, expand medical responses and deliver consistent HVAC.

Hot Springs Medical Clinic

Sanders County Community Development Corporation Thompson Falls, MT

\$745,122

The requested funds will be spent on reconstruction of the clinic building. A new building will add more exam rooms, labs, facilities and waiting rooms.

The program will include prevention programs to educate patients about the dangers of heightened metabolic risk factors and will allow Billings Clinic to bring endocrinologists and bariatric and metabolic surgeons together to provide better outcomes for our patients.

Funds will provide personnel costs, operating costs and equipment for a comprehensive program to enhance nature education in Montana.

Montana Energy Training Center

Montana State University: Northern

Havre, MT

\$1,000,000

Funds will be used for training equipment at three Montana State University campuses to train and retrain skilled workers who can fill high-priority jobs, as defined by industry and labor partners in various energy sectors.

Montana Graduate Medical Education Initiative

Montana Health Research and Education Foundation

Helena, MT

\$409,200

Funds will be used for staff who will establish a dedicated organization to provide planning and implementation of Graduate Medical Education for Montana.

Montana Pediatric Project--Building Frontier Medicine for Children One Specialist at a Time

\$950,000

Funds will support program initiation, education and outreach for pediatric neurology, emergency care, surgery, neurosurgery and oncology.

Montana Remote STEM Curriculum Development

Funds will be used to staff, equipment and operations to develop a system for Montana students statewide that will provide them with academic skills through participation in an online learning environment. Students working with this system will learn through an interactive virtual environment that has been adapted through cooperation with teachers and software designers to provide a standards-based learning framework.

Montana Technology Innovation Partnership (MTIP)

\$1,000,000

Funding will be used over four years to sponsor and promote appropriate workshops and training, and the services of skilled local consultants for SBIR and commercialization planning.

Native American and Rural Health Initiative

University of Montana

Missoula, MT

\$1,000,000

Funds will support staff that work with Montana tribal college instructors and their students, tribal health entities and rural health programs to develop and implement educational activities for people interested in Native American and rural health professions.

New Hospital Construction

Livingston Health Care

Livingston, MT

\$500,000

Funds will be used to construct a new hospital that will provide a scope and level of healthcare services that are substantially the same as those provided now, but contained within a single location that is up to current standards. The new location will include the hospital, medical office space and ancillary services such as radiology, laboratory, physical therapy and other services.

New Hospital Construction & Equipment

St. John's Lutheran Hospital

\$500,000

Funds will be used to purchase equipment for the inpatient wing of the new hospital as they replace the 58-year old building that does not meet code or allow critical equipment to run on emergency power.

Northern Rockies Rural Family Medicine Residency Program

\$1,500,000

The funding for this program will allow for the development of a model residency program in a community based teaching health center and critical access hospital.

Northwestern Montana Rural Health Care Careers Center

Flathead Valley Community College

Kalispell, MT

\$1,393,500

Funds will be used for equipment and personnel to strengthen the high tech industry in northwestern Montana by better preparing FVCC's local engineering, physics and computer science students to contribute within this promising sector.

Outpatient Mental Health Network

Saint Patrick Hospital and Health Sciences Center

Missoula, MT

\$800,000

Funds will be used to purchase and install telemedicine equipment and cover the start-up costs for salaries and supplies that will establish a new Outpatient Mental Health Network in western Montana that will assist regional hospitals in managing behavioral health patients seeking treatment.

Registered Nursing and Dental Assisting Education

Funds will replace obsolete computers and software, adding three portable dental field operatories to train students for rural areas.

Funds will be used to hire staff that will expand the dropout prevention program 30% by serving an additional 300 at-risk students in grades seven through twelve.

Funds will be used for first responder / technical staff and resources necessary to design/create simulation-based training, development of specific rural-based training scenarios, integration with the simulation products being developed for the Air Force Pararescuemen as a result of the NCHCI's FY10 DOD appropriation, and integration with training for rural healthcare practitioners.

Southcentral Montana Workforce Incubation and Retention Center

\$500,000

Funds will be used to continue a pilot project to develop the infrastructure, services and partnerships necessary to train today's and tomorrow's workforce for existing and new businesses and industries.

South Billings Education, Training and Skills Development Support Center

\$750,000

Funds will be used for equipment and personnel to develop a three-year pilot program to establish a comprehensive Education, Training and Skills Development Support Center on Billings' South Side.

Suicide Intervention Access and Outreach Program

\$259,000

This project will create a cohesive, statewide regional response to services for suicide intervention by enhancing the existing 211 infrastructures and adding six staff members who will coordinate resource and crisis service delivery throughout the state.

Tribal Dialysis Unit

Assiniboine and Sioux Tribes of the Fort Peck Reservation

\$1,000,000

Funds will be used to expand Fort Peck Tribal Dialysis Unit from 10 stations to 18 stations and provide the necessary equipment to meet the growing dialysis population on the Fort Peck Reservation and all of Northeast Montana.

Tribal Wellness Center Youth Program

Box Elder, MT

\$275,000

Funding will support staff and equipment to implement various physical fitness activities, intensive substance abuse prevention, suicide prevention and intervention, and healthy alternatives to juvenile delinquency.

Western Montana Homeless Facility

Poverello Center, Inc.

Missoula, MT

\$1,000,000

This project will convert an adjacent building to the current shelter into an appropriate and handicap accessible public facility that will provide emergency shelter, medical care, supportive services, and food to 7,000 Montanans each year.

White Clay Language Immersion School Bus Request

Fort Belknap College Harlem, MT \$78,000

The project will support the White Clay Language Immersion School's efforts to revitalize the Gros Ventre (White Clay or A'aniinin) language by training young tribal members to become fluent speakers by purchasing a bus to transport students.
